Investigating symmetry – what things in your garden can you find that have symmetrical

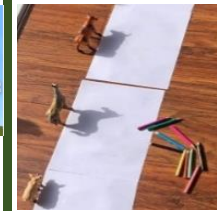
features (leaves, flowers, butterflies, insects) Try cutting some of the leaves/flowers that you have found in half and drawing the other half using reflective symmetry.

Learn a new song! 'You are my sunshine!'



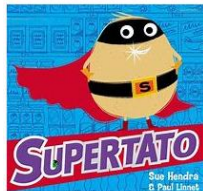

Shaving Foam Rain Clouds

Science Experiment



Method

1. Fill the small bowls with water, then add a different food colouring to each. The more food colouring you add, the darker the colour will be.
2. Fill your large glass or vase up to about 2/3 full.
3. Squirt a generous amount of shaving foam on top of the water to create a 'cloud'.
4. Drop small amounts of coloured water onto the 'cloud' using the pipette or syringe.

You will need:

- Clear glass or vase with a wide brim
- Food colouring
- Shaving foam
- Small bowls
- Water
