The easiest way to make pompoms?

There are many ways to make pomporns but this is by far the simplest and fastest method I have come across. All you need is a fork, some yam, and a pair of scissors.

1. You'll need some yarn, a fork, and a pair of scissors.



Lay a short length of yarn between the middle tines of the fork as shown. (This will be used to tie the pompor.)

 Start wrapping the ball of yarn around the fork tines. Hold the short piece of yarn against the handle of the fork to keep it out of the way.

Continue wrapping 50-60 times around, then cut off the end of the yarn.





Next, wrap the short piece of yarn tightly around the centre of the bundle, pull tight, and tie a square knot.

6. Slide the bundle off the fork.

Carefully cut each loop. (This step will take adult help.)

pomporn will look rather scruffy. Give it a "hair cut" and trim to a nice round shape.

9. Rub the pomporn between your palms to fluff it up!

 Stick two pompores together, add a beak and eyes and you have a chick!
