Assemblies

We began this week by introducing Road Safety week and how there is no need to speed! We learnt that the stopping distance at 20mph is 12 metres but almost doubles to 23m when driving at 30mph. With the traffic wardens back again this week it seems poignant to highlight the **free** parking at Shaw Social club which is a 2-3 minute walk away – this will save on any fines. Yesterday, Y6 shared with the school and their families, memories of their residential last week – the photos and videos were fantastic too. Lockdown Procedures

At School, we take safeguarding and safety very seriously. It is important that we continue to review all Health and Safety procedures, taking into account even those events that are unlikely to occur. As part of this process, we practise a procedure known as "Lockdown" in relation to Martyn's Law. Our Lockdown Procedure would be used when there is a threat to the safety of students, staff and others in school, and when it is safer for everyone to remain in school as opposed to evacuate. This involves staying in an internal room with doors, windows, blinds closed until an all clear is given (a member of SLT will contact classes).

Our procedure ensures that when a potential threat is known, the school is alerted by a lockdown alarm. This alarm will be shared in assembly next Monday (a set of 3 rings of a bell) followed by a practise drill later that day. Please communicate with your child between now and then to provide support if you think they may find this drill challenging.

Sport Events

The Winchcombe School hosted their first home match of the year on Monday evening. They showed great teamwork and resilience throughout the 3 mini games played against tough competition from St Finian's School and Cold Ash. We were extremely proud of them and many thanks to the families who came to support and cheer them on too!
